Day 10: Sunday, July 7

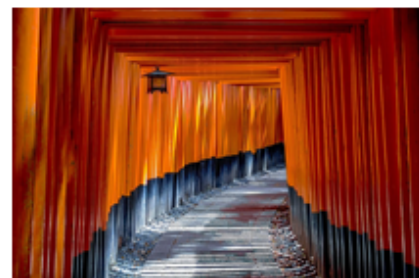
